Overview



The EDGE program is a 3 week intensive review of basic skills in math, English/reading, or both, along with student development workshops.

Provides incoming and continuing College of the Desert students the opportunity to review eligible subjects and retake the assessment test, in hopes of reducing the number of remedial courses needed.





Why do students need EDGE?



Lack of College Preparation

Nationwide: 60%

College of the Desert: 93% Math 81% English *Fall 2015 FTCS, Office of Institutional Research





History & Growth

- Pilot project funded by Title V HSI.
- Began in 2012, with 22 students
- Instructional Faculty, Staff & SI Leaders

2012: Students reviewed both subjects and were recruited based on their math AND English accuplacer results. First Time College Students (22) Math 60 & English 51

2013: Students had the option of reviewing either subject or both, and were recruited based on their math and/or English accuplacer results. First Time College Students (69)

Math 60 & English 51

2014: Students had the option of reviewing either subject or both, and were recruited based on their math and/or English accuplacer results. New & Continuing (265) Math 40, 54, 60 & English 70 & 71

2015: New & Continuing (459) Math 40, 54, 60 & English 70 & 71 Expanded to 3 locations





EDGE 2016



690 Students, New & Continuing

Expanded to 5 locations: Palm Desert, Palm Springs, Indio, Desert Hot Springs, Mecca-Thermal.

Added Night Sessions





798 Total Remedial Levels Removed 608 Levels of Math Removed 190 Levels of English/Reading Removed

10.2% Students Eliminated <u>All</u> Remedial Math 8.9% Students Eliminated <u>All</u> Remedial English 1.8% Students Eliminated <u>All</u> Remedial Courses






