



How do I bookmark a discussion?

- Go to the home page of the appropriate community (in this case, Career Pathways) and select the *discussions* tab near the middle of the screen.




- Scroll down the page to view the existing discussions and choose the one you want to view.
- Scroll to the bottom of that page and hover over the *Subscribe to: Posts of type Discussion* for a list of subscription options.



- Choose your preference to bookmark this discussion by selecting *Bookmark this* in the dropdown menu of options:
 - o Subscribe to: This Post
 - o Subscribe to: Posts of type Discussion

- Unsubscribe from: Discussion Posts in “Name of Group is here”
 - Report this Content
 - **Bookmark this.**
- Go to *MY LINCS*, select *Bookmarks* tab. You can choose from the bookmarks list here to go directly to a particular discussion.
