NYBEST NCLEX: The Results



- LPN cumulative pass rate of 93%, double national rate for immigrant professionals (46%).
- LPNs doubled wages (120%) from average \$12.02 per hour to \$26.45 after course.
- RN cumulative pass rate of 65%, double national rate for immigrant professionals (32%).
- RNs doubled wages (120%) from average of \$11.61 per hour to \$29.00 after course.




Community-based agency providing literacy, GED, ESL and career pathways/college transition services

Customized Training Process





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Outcomes & Lessons

Outcomes:

- 55% advanced at least one EFL
- 75% demonstrated improvement in targeted tasks
- 80% retained employment
- **75%** students satisfaction with classes
- 65% employer satisfaction with classes

Recommendations:

- This is **customized** training (not an ESL class in a plant)
- Stakeholder buy-in critical (all parties involved in the planning)
- **Timing** is everything (paid participation vs. unpaid participation)
- Establish realistic expectations (educate the employer)
- Incentives are important (ask participants what motivates them)
- Employers need to **invest** in this service (\$)
